By becoming a Children's Centre Volunteer we can offer you this and much more.

We can help you to:

- Gain a qualification through training with organisations in and around Gateshead
- Learn new skills by volunteering in specific Children's Centre Groups and Activities
- Gain entry into employment by volunteering in an activity that suits you
- Feel valued in your local community and offer plenty of support along the way
- Find work experience with Gateshead Council



It does not matter how much or how little time you are able to give. From one hour to five days a week there is no limit to the amount of volunteering opportunities on offer.

There are lots of ways you can get involved.

You can:

- Support staff in Children's Centre Groups and Activities
- Provide help for Children's Centre Events and outings
- Have an active role to play in your local Children's Centre
- Support new parents accessing a Children's Centre for the first time
- Decide how you want to volunteer with an activity to suit you



How to become a Children's Centre Volunteer

There are a number of simple steps to take to become a Children's Centre Volunteer.

- Visit any Children's Centre in Gateshead to pick up an application pack
- Meet with a member of the Children's Centre team
- Complete a CRB and Medical Health Questionnaire document
- Final meeting to identify a group or activity to start volunteering
- Congratulations you are now a Children's Centre Volunteer
